A Statement of Attainment will be issued for all units of competency successfully attained. All units are drawn from the qualification **10556NAT Advanced Diploma of Film, Television and Theatre Acting**.

Non supervised activity will involve the student:

- undertaking self-paced study, research and reading of prescribed texts and scripts
- undertaking rehearsals and preparing scenes for assessment and performance
- sourcing and preparing costume and props required for performances
- work experience including auditions, role play scenarios and short film productions
- film reviews and prescribed book reviews
